| Covered healthcare providers are not subject to penalties for violations of the HIPAA Privacy, Security, and Breach Notification Rules that occur in the good faith provision of telehealth during the COVID-19 nationwide public health emergency. | OCR is providing a 90-calendar day transition period for covered health care providers to comply with the HIPAA Rules with respect to their provision of telehealth. The transition period will be in effect beginning on May 12, 2023, and will expire at 11:59 p.m. on August 9, 2023. |
| Covered healthcare providers may use popular applications that allow for video chats, including Apple FaceTime, Facebook Messenger video chat, Google Hangouts video, Zoom, or Skype, to provide telehealth without the risk that OCR might seek to impose a penalty. | Covered healthcare providers should provide services through technology vendors that meet HIPAA-compliant standards and will enter into HIPAA business associate agreements (BAAs) in connection with the provision of their video communication products.
